Burnouts

THE NATION'S TOP BURNOUT DRIVERS WILL LAY ALL THEIR RUBBER ON THE LINE

Every Easter, the Northside Boat Ramp on the banks of the Fitzroy River transforms into the Burnouts Precinct for two highly contested burnout competitions. With over 100 competitors, food vendors, licenced bar stage and entertainment, this is the place to be this Easter.

HOW ARE BURNOUTS JUDGED?

Burnouts may sound thrilling to onlookers, but for entrants, there are challenging judging standards that stand between them and victory.

From the minute the burnout starts, competitors want to achieve 'instant smoke' and then maintain voluminous smoke throughout their run.

The burnout, lasting a minimum of 60 seconds, is also judged on crowd response and vehicle handling.

Entrants can lose points for things like:

- 🕂 stalling
- 🕂 reversing
- 🕂 touching the barriers
- 🕂 failing to leave the pad
- 🕂 still having inflated tires.

WHAT ARE ENTRANTS COMPETING TO WIN?

As an official qualifying event in the national Burnout Masters Series, competitors in the Pro section compete for their ticket to the next Summernats event.

There's also cash prizes on offer across both categories - plus ultimate bragging rights!

Street Drags

SET ON THE SOUTHERN BANK OF THE FITZROY RIVER AND BACKED BY QUEENSLAND'S LONGEST STRIP OF NATIONAL TRUST BUILDINGS IS THE THRILLING ROCKYNATS STREET DRAGS.

Rockhampton's Quay Street comes alive as Australia's fastest street-driven drag cars and bikes roar down the nation's first street-built 1/8th mile drag strip. You may have to beat the crowds for a prime seat, as the speed and calibre of these drag racers is a crowd-pulling, show-stopping event.

With its unique no-fuss format, the Street Drags allows for more cars and more racing than most conventional drag races. In past years, over 400 vehicles were involved accumulating over 1150 passes. Combined with its stunning location and unique street-built drag, the racers come from far and wide to participate in this challenging race.

WHAT IS DRAG RACING?

The Rockynats Street Drags involves two vehicles racing side by side on a straight one-eighth-mile track. The aim is to be the fastest car in the race.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN STREET CLASS AND PRO CATEGORY DRAGS?

As entrants sign their car up to Rockynats, they're asked to estimate how fast their car can do the 1/8th mile. Times slower than 8 seconds over the 1/8th mile qualify for Street Class, and cars between 6.37 and 7.99 seconds head straight to Pro Class.



Cruising

DURING ROCKYNATS YOU CAN EXPECT TO SEE THE STREETS OF ROCKHAMPTON FILLED WITH CARS AND BIKES OF EVERY SHAPE, ERA AND TORQUE.

Over the Easter long weekend, the Rockynats Cruising zone, comes alive with roaring engines, immaculate paintwork and impressive vintage remodeling.

This zone is the Show n' Shine overflow, but these cars aren't just on display! All entrants, with both registered and unregistered cars, will have the chance to cruise within the CBD precinct (East Street and Bolsover Street) on a dedicated route.

For some of these old beautiful vehicles, this is one of their only opportunities to roll through the Rockhampton CBD. Take the time to stroll through the parked cars and bikes and chat to their owners, they may even offer to take you for a ride.

When you aren't admiring the vehicles or cruising the streets, you can enjoy food, cafes and entertainment in this lively part of Rockynats.

WHERE AND WHEN CAN I SEE THE CRUISING ZONE?

This area will be open Saturday and Sunday the Easter long weekend, which makes it a perfect spot to grab a bite, have a rest, or spend a few hours in between other events and entertainment. The Cruising zone is located in the CBD on East Street and Bolsover Street, connected by Denham, William and Derby Street. With an assortment of local cafes and Rockynats food trucks in this area, you can take a moment to refuel your own tank while admiring the vehicles cruising by.

Whether you like a vintage 1950s Chevrolet or a jackedup modern Landcruiser, you'll have more than enough to admire at Rockynats.

Show n Shine

THE BIGGEST DISPLAY-COMPETITION OF NEW, RESTORED AND REMODELLED VEHICLES IN EVERY SHAPE, COLOUR, AND ERA.

Show 'n' Shine showcases the best-of-the-best in paint jobs, remodels, restorations, and new features. You can see over 200 vehicles each day in the Rockynats Show 'n' Shine competition, located in the CBD Precinct along Quay Street. Over the Easter long weekend, you'll be wowed by how stunning, detailed and, well, shiny these vehicles are.

A slower-paced, awe-inspiring aspect of Rockynats, this competition is not to be missed. While kids will be amazed at the mix of colours, shapes, and 'cool' exteriors, adults will love the time-warp of modern top-of-the-line models through to cars and bikes from the 1930s. This is a perfect precinct to grab a bite, slow down along the riverside and chat with the Show 'n' Shine competitors.

WHAT IS THE ROCKYNATS SHOW 'N' SHINE PRECINCT LIKE?

The Rockynats Show 'n' Shine precinct is flanked by the glistening Fitzroy River on one side and Rockhampton heritage buildings on the other. This zone is a competition space unlike any other at Rockynats.

While you can get your heart pumping from the sidelines at the Burnouts, Street Drags, and 4x4 Zone, at the Show 'n' Shine you can slow down and immerse yourself amongst these impressive vehicles. This precinct covers over 700m of road along Quay and Denham Streets, so there is plenty to see. Take the time to start at one end and stroll through the displays, chat with the competitors, and grab a coffee or a bite to eat along the way.



Drifting

NOTHING SAYS "HIGH-OCTANE ACTION" LIKE SOME OF AUSTRALIA'S HIGHEST PROFILE DRIFTING DRIVERS ALL IN ONE PLACE.

Hosted by Drift Cadet on the banks of the Fitzroy River, you can watch the best-of-the-best drifting racers give their all in the Victoria Parade car park in the CBD precinct. The Rockynats drifting events are exclusive invitation-only competitions, so spectators can expect to see national and global level drifting.

If watching isn't thrilling enough, 'hot laps' (or passenger rides) will also be available for brave ticketholders.

HOW DOES DRIFTING WORK?

Drifting is essentially when a driver intentionally oversteers and causes the back wheels (or sometimes all wheels) to lose traction on the road and start to spin. The driver can then use a number of different drifting techniques to cause the back wheels to 'drift' as they control the car through and out of the turn. Technically a 'drift' is when the difference between the direction faced and direction travelled is greater for the back wheels of the car compared to the front.

It's important to note that while the professionals and movies make drifting look easy, drifting is a tricky maneuver, and it's easy to lose control.

HOW IS DRIFTING JUDGED?

Drifting requires an enormous amount of control. Once the driver begins the course, they will be judged on the consistency of their speed, how closely they follow the line of the track, the angle of the vehicle rotation and their individual style. Judges may also look for commitment, fluidity and overall execution.

GET UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL WITH CUSTOMISED ELITE CARS AT ROCKYNATS

Prepare for jaw-dropping 'wow' moments as the Elite Show gets underway from the Friday evening of Rockynats.

For any lover of pristine restorations, no-holds-barred customising and upcycling, the Elite Pavilion at the Showgrounds is generally the first stop. It'll be hard to tear yourself away.

And even if you know nothing at all about cars, just the spectacle of mirror finishes, ultimate attention to detail and the atmosphere of excitement and the pride of accomplishment makes it a very worthwhile experience.

Under one roof, you'll see cars never before exhibited in Australia, alongside some returning favourites going up against the big boys. Yes, the prize money is significant, but most entrants are in it for the sheer joy of creating a one-of-a-kind showstopper.

CAR UNVEILING AT THE ELITE PAVILION

The anticipation at the Elite unveiling is something else.

For the car owners, the sky is the limit when it comes to fulfilling their vision. Most of the vehicles you'll see were purchased in a run down or quite different state to how they're presented at the Elite Show.

JOIN US FOR AUSTRALIA'S LARGEST STREET PARADE ON GOOD FRIDAY

Truly a marathon of delights for spectators as over 1,500 of Australia's top burnout cars, speed demons, loved classics, sick hogs, and suped-up creations pour out of the Rockynats Showgrounds precinct.

Grab your spot early along the route through Rockhampton's historic CBD as this well attended (and free!) Street Parade is a favourite of fans and locals alike. Drink in the atmosphere, packed in like sardines amongst Rocky and Australia's friendliest crowd of rev-heads.

This event is a favourite of our Rockynats entrants too. This is a unique chance for our car and bike owners to show off their prized classics and creations to streets of adoring automotive fans. This is a cruise to remember.

The Street Parade is a chance to show appreciation to our entrant's hard work, our support personnel (QPS, QAS, SES and Rural Fire Brigade), and our Rockynats Sponsors who are invited to participate.

HOW DOES THE STREET PARADE WORK?

The 1,500+ cars begin to queue at the Rockynats Showgrounds Precinct - and its a sight to behold. Diehard fans line the exit point (in a position they have staked out well in advance) to watch the vehicles file out.

The cars and bikes tour through the suburb of Wandal, before hugging the Fitzroy River on their way toward the historic Quay and East Streets in the city's CBD. The parade then returning to the Showgrounds Precinct for a day and night of entertainment.

Fan favourite spots include; the Lion Creek Road initial leg, the leafy Victoria Parade, Quay Street's Riverside Precinct, and stunning East Street Mall.

APPLICATION PROCESS

APPLICATIONS WILL BE ASSESSED BASED ON SUITABILITY TO THE EVENT AND THE FOLLOWING EVENT SELECTION CRITERIA:

Preference will be given to applicants with product or experience that will complement and enhance the event

- Applicants must meet all requirements, including festival theming and supply the relevant documentation outlined in the application checklist
- Applicants that can trade during event operating hours as stated in the event program
- Applicants who can bump in on time and leave their site as they found it: clean and devoid of waste

First round applicants will be notified of the result of their application via email on **27 October 2023.**

Successful applications will receive a trade site offer with further details around the event, its requirements and terms of trade. Those selected will then have the opportunity to accept the offer and are required to make full payment by **10 November 2023** to secure their site.

Once we reach capacity, unsuccessful applicants will be placed on a waiting list. In the event of a cancellation or declined offer, Rockynats will refer to the waiting list and make second round offers.

Applicants will be asked to select their preferred event precinct in their application, however Rockynats cannot guarantee any particular site and reserves the right to offer similarly sized or priced sites if required.

Applications must be submitted online through the Rockynats website.

It is the responsibility of the food vendor, market retailer or business trader to outfit their site in a visually appealing manner to theme with Rockynats.

KEY TRADING INFORMATION

BUMP IN / SITE SET-UP

- Trade site holders will recieve a detailed bump in kit closer to the event.
- Trade site holders must report to the Rockynats Site Office at the Rockhampton Showgrounds to collect a "Bump In" Pass prior to site set-up. Evidence of the completed site safety induction must also be presented at this time.
- Trade site holders must collect their workforce accreditation prior to entering the event precincts for site set-up. Vehicle Passes must be clearly displayed in the windscreen.
- Sites are required to be set up and ready for the opening of the event precinct (refer to individual event precinct times).
- Vehicles are only permitted within the event precincts during the bump in / bump out period. No vehicle access is permitted during event precinct operating hours. Deliveries to trade sites must be completed outside event precinct operating hours.
- All vehicles not part of your site display must be parked outside the event precincts, within the general spectator parking areas. Vehicles are not permitted to park within the event precincts and will be towed at the owner's expense.

BUMP OUT / SITE PACK DOWN

- Site pack down may commence after all program and competition is completed. Time to be provided closer to the event.
- Vehicles used to pack down sites will not be permitted access to the event precincts before 6pm, 31 March 2024.
- All trade site property must be removed from the event precincts by 6pm, 1 April 2024.
 Sites must be left in a tidy manner, all rubbish must be taken with you. Any items left behind will be disposed of.

ACCREDITATION AND VEHICLE PASSES


- Each trade site holder will receive x4 accreditations per site (names will be required) workforce accreditation wristbands. Workforce accreditation is NOT transferable and must be registered in the name of the attendee.
- Workforce accreditation is only to be used for food vendors, retail markets and business traders attending Rockynats 2024. Should you require passes for family and/or friends please purchase them from the ticketing office.
- Each trade site holder will receive one (1) vehicle pass to gain entry to the event precincts for bump in / bump out. To minimise vehicle traffic, additional vehicle passes will not be available under any circumstances.
- If your vehicle forms part of your display, no vehicle movement is permitted during event precinct operating hours.
- Vehicles will not be permitted access to the precinct unless the vehicle pass is displayed in the windscreen.
- Accreditation can be collected from a central location which will be advised closer to the event.

PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE

- All trade site holders are required to hold a public liability insurance policy current at the time of Rockynats 2024 (including bump-in/bump-out period) for an amount not less than twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000).
- The insurance policy must list Rockhampton Regional Council as an interested party and cover liability to Council for loss of or damage to property and death or injury to any person.
- A certificate of currency issued by your insurer must be uploaded at the time of submitting your application.

CANCELLATIONS

- Rockhampton Regional Council reserves the right to cancel or postpone Rockynats 2024 for any reason. In the situation of an event cancellation by Council prior to the commencement of the event, Council will reimburse the site fee. All other costs incurred by the trade site holder such as accommodation and travel will not be reimbursed.
- In the event of cancellation by the trade site holder, Council will not reimburse any fees associated with the cancellation including the site fee.



TERMS & CONDITIONS

BY SUBMITTING AN APPLICATION FOR ROCKYNATS 2024, YOU AGREE TO ABIDE BY AND BE BOUND BY THE FOLLOWING TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

- 1. The trade site holder must submit to Rockhampton Regional Council (the Company) a completed Trade Site Application (the Agreement) via the Rockynats website, to apply to book a site at Rockynats 2024 (the Event).
- 2. The site fees must be paid in full to Rockhampton Regional Council (RRC) to the nominated RRC account by the payment deadline to confirm your booking. Payment method will be supplied upon notification of successful application.
- 3. Rockhampton Regional Council reserves the right to cancel or postpone Rockynats 2024 for any reason. In the situation of an event cancellation by Council prior to the commencement of the event, Council will reimburse the site fee. All other costs incurred by the trade/market site holder such as accommodation and travel will not be reimbursed. In the event of cancellation by the trade/market site holder, Council will not reimburse any fees associated with the cancellation including the site fee.
- 4. The trade/market site holder indemnifies Council against claims by any person in respect of injury, death or loss of or damage to any property, resulting from or in any way connected to the trade/market site holder.
- 5. All trade/market site holders are required to hold a public liability insurance policy current at the time of Rockynats 2024 (including bump-in/bump-out period) for an amount not less than twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000). The insurance policy must list Rockhampton Regional Council as an interested party and cover liability to Rockhampton Regional Council for loss of or damage to property and death or injury to any person.
- 6. All food vendors must supply only reusable or 100% compostable food ware to their customers at Rockynats 2024 (this includes straws, stirrers, cutlery and plates).
- 7. Trade/market site holders are not permitted to sublet their site.

- 8. Rockhampton Regional Council event organisers retain the right to enter your site at any time and request the removal of any article, sign, collateral which is deemed not eligible for display or is considered offensive.
- 9. Power is NOT included in the fees and is available for purchase in addition to your site. All lighting must be supplied by the trade/market site holder.
- 10. Any electrical equipment or leads brought into the event by a trade/market site holder are required to have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor within the last 12 months and be compliant for the entirety of the event.
- 11. Any faults or power failures caused due to a trade/ market site holder's underestimation will be charged to the trade/market site holder.
- 12. All food vendors must comply with health requirements of the *Food Act 2006*, Food Regulation 2016 and the Food Safety Standards. Rockhampton Regional Council Environmental Health Officers may inspect your business to ensure the requirements are being met.
- 13. Successful food vendor applicants are required to have a current Food Business Licence where applicable.
- 14. Dumping of your used water or waste on the ground/ or in the gardens is not permitted and is a direct breach of Environmental Laws in place across Australia.
- 15. Food Vendors using gas are required to have a current Gas System Compliance Certificate (AS/ NZS 5601:2:2010 Gas Installations). Food Vendors at the event must have a copy of their Gas System Compliance Certificate available for viewing by Gas Inspector/s and Council officers during the event. You are required to submit the Gas System Compliance Certificate issued no older than 12 months from the date of inspection with your application and be compliant for the entirety of the Event.
- 16. Site placement and layout is determined by the event organiser.

- 17. Trade/market site holders must not encroach onto any walkways or pedestrian access. If the event organiser identifies a potential safety hazard within the site, you must comply with instructions to remove the hazard.
- 18. Food, retail and business traders agree to comply with Federal, State, and Local laws including but not limited to COVID-19 frameworks and legislation, together with any fire, police, health and/or public safety laws, regulations or ordinances which are or may be applicable.
- 19. It is the responsibility of the trade/market site holder to maintain a clean, tidy and waste free site at all times. All property must be removed at the conclusion of the event and vacant sites must be left in a tidy manner. Any items left behind will be disposed of.
- 20. Rockhampton Regional Council will not be liable for any theft, loss or damage to property during the event, bump-in or bump-out period.
- 21. Trade/market site holders shall not erect or display any form of signage, promotional or advertising material on or around the precinct outside the boundaries of their allocated site.
- 22. The trade/market site holder shall not conduct any leaflet dropping, questionnaires, surveys or offer to the public any free products and/or materials on or around the grounds outside the boundaries of the allocated site.
- 23. The trade/market site holder shall not conduct and lottery, raffle, guessing competition, game of chance or sale by auction on the grounds without the prior written approval of Rockhampton Regional Council and the applicable permit/license from the relevant governing body.
- 24. Microphones, sound amplifiers and machine demonstrations will be permitted only so long as they cause no annoyance to neighbouring trade/market site holders or the visiting public.
- 25. The site set up must be completed and the display open for business and manned always during the event operating hours. The trade/market site holder shall not dismantle, remove or pull-down the site or any part of it before the close of business on the final day of the event.

- 26. Vehicles involved in the set-up of trade/market sites must be removed from the event precincts prior to opening. Vehicles are not permitted to park within the event precinct. Vehicles forming part of the trade/market site display are not permitted to move during event operating hours.
- 27. Vehicles involved in the dismantling of trade/ market sites will not be permitted entry to the event precincts before the close of the event on the final event day. Vehicle passes must be affixed to the windscreen to gain access to the event precincts.
- 28. COVID Safe Event Plan measures will be dependent on government guidelines at the time of the event.
- 29. Abusive, aggressive behaviour will not be tolerated towards other site holders, spectators, volunteers and staff. This behaviour may result in the ejection from the event. No fees or costs will be refunded
- 30. Site conditions left in an reasonable state may incur a cleaning fee and will be charged directly to the site holder for payment. Outstanding fees to council will omit you for eligibility to attend as a vendor at future events.
